I, Blanche H. Gunn, being of sound mind and discretion, hereby declare this to be my Last Will and Testament:

I herewith devise and bequeath unto my dear cousin, Mrs. Mary Katherine Mims of Tampa, Florida all my personal property with the following exceptions:

To my cousin Frances Gunn James, Sanford, NC I will our Grandmother's sugar chest, a miniature chest of drawers, small silver teapot and 6 silver demitasse cups all with initial "J" engraved on them.

To my cousin Mary Gunn Rumbolt of Sanford, NC I will a pair of walnut picture frames, one of which belonged to her Grandmother Gunn, my barley glass and a miniature chest.

To Lottie Gunn (Mrs. Tom Gunn, their mother) of Sanford, NC I will a large diamond ring and my platinum pin.

To Lillian Dalton, Winston Salem, NC I Will an antique mirror and miniature chest.

To Mary All Jordan, my faithful maid, if still in my employ or if she has left it in some satisfactory reason, I will my maple antique 4 poster bed with springs, mattress, pillows, etc; the antique beside table that goes with it, an antique chest with an old mirror; my bleeding heart glass and any 12 pieces of other glass or china she chooses; \$1300 in cash; my small diamond ring, and my automobile.

Any real estate I may own, I Will to the Methodist Children's Home, Winston Salem, NC; the proceeds of which are to be used as a practical memorial to my mother, Mrs. Eugenia Hazel Gunn - if the real estate has been sold, I wish the equivalent given - after the above provisions have been executed and my debts paid, all the rest of my personal property...including any stocks and bonds, I will to go to my cousins aforementioned.

I also appoint herewith Harold L. Mims (Mary Katherine's husband) of Tampa, Florida my sole executor and it is decreed that he be not required to furnish bond and is to have full power to sell at private or public sale the same as I would have if alive.

I wish also that he receive the usual percent for services rendered.
